

2024 School Oats Program

Ensuring a nutritious meal is essential for a productive day, and oats offer an abundance of nutrients for optimal nourishment. Our 2024 School Oats Program focused on promoting the benefits of a balanced diet and improving children's overall well-being.

We are excited to announce that the School Oats Program has attracted considerable interest. Schools from various areas across Alberta, including Bowden, Foremost, Glendon, Grassy Lake, Lacombe, Ponoka, Rainier, Rimbey, Stirling, and Strathmore, have committed to prioritizing their students' nutritional needs.

The School Oats Program was available to both rural and urban schools across Alberta, providing bursaries of \$350 to 10 schools based on demonstrated need. Running from March to June 2024, the application window was open from March 1 to April 1, 2024. The selected schools would use the bursary to purchase oats and oat-based foods. Additionally, each chosen school received an engaging poster designed to enhance students' understanding of oat nutrition, and each student from these schools was given a recipe card to take home.





From the 15 schools that registered, the following 10 have been selected to participate in this year's program:

These posts showcased the bursary's availability, featured tasty oat recipes, and shared general knowledge about the nutritional benefits of oats. Our social media campaign aimed to raise awareness and encourage participation in the School Oats Program, reaching a wide audience and fostering a community committed to healthy eating and balanced meals featuring oats. We also promoted the program extensively through our teacher newsletter, ensuring broad engagement across our educational community.
